TIS THE SEASON TO BECOME UNGLUED

Luke 19:10 "For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost."

"Lost" meaning in the sense of that which is in ruin to perish.

"But when the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His Son... to redeem those who were under the law, that we might receive the adoption as sons" (Gal. 4:5). The fullness of time was the time for the coming of Christ as the second Adam to make provision for mankind's transition from bondage to spiritual sonship; recovering that which the first Adam failed to retain. 

Articles of Interest...

"Right to Work"

The General Assembly session doesn't begin until January, but Delegate Dickie Bell has already introduced *HJ2*, an amendment to add Virginia's "right to work" law to the State Constitution. This amendment is a second resolution and will be sent to voters for ratification if it's passed by the GA.

Make no mistake - *HJ2* is not about freedom. Real freedom in the workplace is about being able to balance life with work, attending a parent-teacher conference or helping a loved one get to a medical appointment.

Virginia's Constitution is a sacred document and should not be changed to include anti-worker amendments like "right to work." Virginia families deserve better, and our representatives should focus on strengthening our communities and creating good jobs.

Want to know more about so-called "right to work" (RTW) laws?

- Despite its misleading name, this type of law does not guarantee anyone a job and it does not protect workers against unfair firing. Virginia is an at-will employment state, so unless you have the protection of a (union) contract, you can be fired without cause.
- No one can be forced to join a union. Federal labor law already guarantees this - in all states, regardless of RTW laws.
- By undermining unions, so-called "right to work" laws weaken the best job security protections workers have - the union contract.
- According to data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the average household income in states with RTW laws is \$6,568 (almost 12%) less than in other states.
- Workers in states with RTW laws are less likely to have health insurance provided by their employer than workers in other states. Those who do have insurance generally pay higher premiums and incur greater out of pocket costs for prescription drugs, doctor visits, and other medical care.
- States with RTW laws experience higher than 54% more workplace fatalities each year than other states.
 These states invest less in education and experience higher poverty and infant mortality rates, too.

Unions improve workers' standard of living - not "right to work" laws. When workers stand together to collectively bargain, they win things like fair wages, safer work places, retirement security, better benefits, and a fair grievance process to address problems when they arise.
